

Dear Cherished Supporter,

We believe that 2022 would hold new value for the community and we were able to do just that. It was a time of renewal and growth. We built new partnerships within the community, held new events like our Trunk-or-Treat, Community Resource Fair, and hosted One St. Lucie County Faith Leaders Roundtable meetings at our Campus to bring the community together.

Our Member Share Grocery Program (MSGP) continues to assist the community to save up to 70% of their monthly grocery budget as the result of the economy and rise in food cost. We upgraded our point-of-sale system and are consistently receiving a variety of products to make sure our members have the best selection. A total of 5,671 unique households accessed food from the SLC MSGP in 2022. That saved our members \$4.55 million which is vital for other household expenses.

Our Success Training Employment Program (STEP) came off one of the best years we have seen. We brought on new staff to elevate our program. We graduated 42 individuals from Phase I of in class training. They learned emotional intelligence, (EQ), and obtained job acquisition workplace skills (JAWS). Phase II of our program is where our participants gain employment through our valuable network of employer partners. We had 25 individuals gain employment. Phase III gives participants that gained employment up to 3 years with a Success Coach to continue working on financial goals, career, and personal growth.

Our Life Enrichment Center (LEC) was busy building relationships with community partners to ensure the best resources were available to individuals. Our Crisis Stabilization team helped 6,436 households with 1,627 different services including housing or utility assistance, emergency food, health, education, and one-time referrals to obtain assistance. We also continue to assist individuals in applying for Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) through Medicare and Medicaid and our partnership with the Department of Children and Families (DCF) located in our center.

None of this would have been possible without our network of individual donors, foundations, Community Advisory Board and volunteers who stepped UP and provided their time, talent, and treasures throughout the year. We thank you for your dedication and commitment to the community. Our mission would not be possible without YOU!




